Apologies for absence

Family Voice grant application

The application to consider the £500.00 funding request towards electrical works in the Goldhay Centre was discussed. Family Voice is a registered charity and has many regular service users from within the parish. Although Family Voice financial accounts seem healthy; the majority of their funds are restricted grants and ring fenced for specific projects. The installation of additional electrical sockets for the community centre hall, kitchen and offices were identified during the full 5-year EICR inspection. The total cost of the works is £2294.40. A grant of £500.00 towards the cost of the works has already been secured from Orton Longueville Parish Council. Family Voice will pay the remaining cost. It was RESOLVED to award Family Voice the full grant amount of £500.00.

Local police matters

Cllr Howell reported that she is still waiting for a meeting with the Police & Crime Commissioner to discuss the lack of policing in the Ortons.

It was noted that there had recently been an anti-vaxxer incident at Napier Place whilst the vaccination clinic was open and the police took a long time to turn up.

Ward Councillors

Cllr Howell gave the following report:

Bushes

The council has published its schedule for cutting back bushes. The bushes in our ward will be cut back in January. In the meantime, any areas that are a particular problem should be reported to the council via fixmystreet.com

Street racing

This continues to be a problem with the police reluctant to use their powers to either stop or prevent it. Julie chairs a group at the council that will make recommendations to the cabinet on measures the council ought to take to address the problem.

Unauthorised encampments

We had a particularly challenging unauthorised encampment in Gostwick over the August bank holiday and beyond. The council used its powers to evict the group, but this took nearly three weeks. Unfortunately, the police refused to use their powers to move the group on more quickly. At one point, there were four separate encampments in the ward in the space of a week. The encampment that was at Gostwick moved to Orton Longueville, then to Gunthorpe and is now in Werrington. The clean-up at

Gostwick took a considerable amount of time and resources, as the group had used a public footpath as an outside toilet. We were very unhappy about the lack of police response, particularly as the group was accessing the space via a residents' garden, and we have asked the Police and Crime Commissioner and the Cambs and Peterborough Mayor to take action.

Discarded medication

Twice in the past week, we have found un-used medication dumped in the street. Residents are asked to return any unused medication to a pharmacy.

Peterborough Market

The Council has proposed moving the market from its current Northminster location to Bridge Street.

Hinchcliffe

We met with representatives of Cross Keys Homes and Up The Garden Bath to discuss improvement to an area that is a fly-tip hotspot.

Brown bins

Collections are suspended until January 2022. However, there will be one further collection in 2021, date to be confirmed.

Cllr Knight gave the following report:

Mopeds

These are still an ongoing issue with youths on mopeds with multiple riders on one bike. Another incident occurred this evening to which police were called to. Apparently parents are not aware that their children are doing this and therefore Cllr Knight has asked Bushfield Ormiston Academy to put a newsletter out to all parents warning them of the dangers of riding a moped with no safety helmet on and with more than one rider on them.

Drug misuse

This issue is a regular occurrence near the Pennington park flowers beds and has been reported to Peterborough City Council and police.

The Gannocks

1. Two quotations for play equipment for the clearing in the wooded area have been received. The Clerk is in the process of obtaining a third quote.
2. Meadow management advice provided by former Parish Councillor Roger Proudfoot was discussed. Cllr Farnham stated that another year is needed to see if the previous sown wildflowers have been established. It was noted that the bio diversity of the area has improved. It was agreed that the meadow should now have its annual cut and that the grass arising's are taken away by the end of October. Paths through the meadow will be cut again as this feature has been enjoyed by local residents.

Play parks in the parish

Orton Wistow Play Park is now open with new equipment however a few areas still need to be finished.

- 99/09-21 Parish Ponds**
Relaxing of restrictions and the start of the autumn season, Peterborough Conservation Volunteers have started conservation work again. They had arranged with Peterborough City council to start work again at Debdale Pond and Cherry Orton Pond on 29th August 2021 with a further two sessions on 3rd and 10th October 2021.
- 100/09-21 Parish Lengthsman**
The Lengthsman contract has been renewed for another year until end August 2022.
- 101/09-21 Defibrillator at the Village Hall**
Cllr Howell reported that she had been approached by a local resident asking if a defibrillator could be considered for the village hall. This matter was last raised at a Parish Council meeting in January 2017, agenda item 238/01-17 and it was resolved not to pursue the matter at the February 2017 meeting, agenda item 269/02-17 because the Village Hall Committee stated that ‘they had no real desire for a defibrillator unit for the village hall or to make any monetary contribution to it. Also the unit would need to be housed inside the building because it could be stolen if placed on an outside wall.’
- It was debated whether realistically a defibrillator saves lives when it has to be fetched from a certain point. It was agreed that more data on the subject needs to be obtained. As Oundle Town Council have a defibrillator in the community, it was decided that Cllr Knight will contact them and find out how many times it has been used.
Action: Cllr Knight.
- 102/09-21 Mosaic to commemorate Waterville Ash**
Cllr Howell asked if the Parish Council would consider a commemorative mosaic on the stump of the cut down ash tree on the corner of Cherry Orton Road. The mosaic would be created by an artist called Muni. A plinth would also be added with history information relating to the former ash tree. Cllr Howell stated that she is able to apply for a grant to fund the project from Peterborough City Council (PCC) ‘Think Communities’ and that the local community can be involved in the project. The Parish Council agreed that this was a good idea. Cllr Howell will ask the artist to give the Parish Council a presentation on her work and ideas for the mosaic.
Action: Cllr Howell.
- 103/09-21 Mural for Rangefield Sheltered housing complex**
Cllr Howell reported that the Rangefield Sheltered housing complex has recently had an extension and have a new social area. The walls are currently plain and residents would like a mural painted on one of them to brighten up the room. Unfortunately the Landlord Cross Keys is not interested in doing this. It was agreed that the residents’ social club should apply to the Parish Council for funding of the mural. Cllr Farnham stated that the Orton Charities may also be able to help with some funding. It was also suggested that Cross Keys should also be approached again and asked to pay at least half towards the mural. Cllr Howell will report this back to Rangefield residents.
Action: Cllr Howell.
- 104/09-21 Parking Issues at Ormiston Meadow Academy**
Inconsiderate parking by parents picking up children from Ormiston Meadow Academy at lunchtimes is causing an issue for residents living in Matley. The road is constantly being blocked and residents are sometimes not able to drive in or out of their properties. Recently an ambulance could not get through. The Academy’s response is that they have no control over the matter as it is occurring outside of their grounds. It was stated that this issue should subside in the coming weeks as reception children will then be attending full time.
- As there are also issues with parent parking around Matley at morning and afternoon drop off/ pick up times, Cllr Knight and Ward Cllr Day offered to find out if the Academy would be interested in joining the PCC Council School Streets scheme whereby schools can temporarily close a road outside their entrance, enabling it to become a pedestrian and cycle/scoot zone during the school’s opening and closing times.
Action: Cllr Knight, Cllr Day.
- 105/09-21 Addressing Climate and Nature emergency**
The Parish Council Climate Change Challenge document is now on the Parish Council website. Ward Cllr Day stated that PCC are looking into creating plan templates which can be adjusted to suit individual Parish Councils.

106/09-21 Bulky waste collections at the Orton Centre
Next collection is Saturday 15th January 2022, 10 am – 12 pm.

107/09-21 Parish Council meeting dates
It was reported that Orton Wistow community centre no longer has any evening availability for the Parish Council to change its venue for meetings. It was agreed that meetings will continue as they are however the Clerk will ask the Village Hall to inform her if the hall ever becomes free on another evening.
